

# FOX NEWS POLL

*Questions 1-7, 12, 14-53, and 59 are for release after 6:00PM/ET Wednesday, June 15, 2022.  
All other questions held for future release.*

## **Methodology**

Conducted June 10-13, 2022, this Fox News Poll includes interviews among 1,002 registered voters (RV) nationwide who were randomly selected from a national voter file and spoke with live interviewers. Landline (152) and cellphone (850) telephone numbers were selected for inclusion using a probability proportionate to size method, which means phone numbers for each state are proportional to the number of voters in each state.

Results based on the full sample have a margin of sampling error of  $\pm 3$  percentage points.

The Fox News Poll is conducted under the joint direction of Beacon Research (D) and Shaw & Company Research (R).

Fox News Polls before 2011 were conducted by Opinion Dynamics Corporation.
