*BIOGRAPHIES ORDER RANDOMIZED*

22. Yuh-Line Niou: Yuh-Line Niou is a lifelong Democrat and a powerful progressive leader for low-income, immigrant, and working families. Yuh-Line is a first generation American who immigrated to the U.S as an infant with all of her family’s possessions in just six suitcases. A proud CUNY Baruch graduate, in 2016 Yuh-Line was elected in a historic landslide victory to represent lower Manhattan in the State Assembly, becoming the first Asian-American to represent Chinatown in the State Legislature. In Albany, Yuh-Line has stood up to systemic corruption and negligence and has helped deliver historic victories for tenant protections, affordable housing, consumer protection, and fair taxation of the ultra-wealthy, and she will do the same in Congress.

23. Mondaire Jones: Mondaire Jones is a leading progressive member of Congress running for reelection in New York’s newly drawn 10th Congressional District. Mondaire made history when he was sworn in on January 3, 2021 as the nation’s first openly gay, Black member of Congress. A New York native, Mondaire grew up in Section 8 housing, raised by a single mom who worked multiple jobs to provide for their family. He attended public schools before earning degrees from Stanford University and Harvard Law School and working in the Obama Administration. Mondaire has championed strengthening our democracy, protecting fundamental rights like abortion and marriage equality, making housing affordable, Medicare for All, and universal child care.

In Congress he will fully fund public safety, including responsive and accountable police, and take on the NRA and gun manufacturers.
